This new role of Primary Health Care Nurse Practitioner will assist the program in responding in a timely manner to the higher acuity and complex patient population that has increased with the relocation of the program to the hospital.

This is what you'll be doing:

Reporting to the Manager, Halton Diabetes Program and Diabetes Foot Care Program, the Nurse Practitioner will work within an interdisciplinary team to provide comprehensive health care for adult clients with complex diabetes conditions. The Nurse Practitioner will practice at a high level of autonomy utilizing and demonstrating advanced knowledge and decision making skills to conduct comprehensive assessments, diagnoses in the management of the adult diabetes patients. The incumbent will be the key liaison with primary care, referral partners and the community to ensure seamless transitions, facilitating collaboration among all partners involved in the ongoing care of the patient. The role will be involved in quality improvement and administrative responsibilities, participating in policy and procedure development, as well as program development and evaluation activities.
